The **Secret Agent Society (SAS) Small Group Program** helps kids aged 8 to 12 crack the code of emotions and friendships. SAS will capture and engage your child's attention through spy- themed gamified learning. With a strong evidence base underpinning the program, it has demonstrated effectiveness in improving 4 key life skills:



1. Emotion recognition (in self and others)
2. Emotion regulation (particularly anxiety and anger)
3. Social problem solving
4. Social skills (for friendship and teamwork!)

The SAS program is designed to teach children the skills to be able to:

- Recognize the motions in themselves and others
- Cope with anxiety and anger
- Cope with change
- Solve friendship problems
- Express emotions inappropriate ways
- Recognise and deal with bullying and teasing
- Talk and play with others
- Build and maintain friendships
- Rope with mistakes and losing

Total Program Cost \$3500
(Everything included – Privately funded and NDIS Friendly)

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What does SAS involve?

Child Group Meetings (SAS) Cadet Club Meetings)	Over 11 face-to-face sessions your child learns a new social skill each week in a fun engaging way. The first 9 x 90 minutes sessions are delivered weekly with the following 2 boosters sessions spread over a six-month period. It is important that Cadets and Parents attend all sessions.
Parent Group Meetings	Parent Group Sessions: commence with a 2-hour Parent Only Induction Session, followed by weekly 30-minute sessions, held after the cadet meeting over the course of the program. Parent group meetings are held throughout the program to advise and support parents on the content of child group meetings and how to help their children apply their SAS skills in real life.
School Support	Parents/mentors can update classroom teachers on the skills and content that children are learning through SAS and how they can support the application of skills in the classroom and playground. This occurs through a series of SAS Teacher Tip Sheets that parents/mentors can access through the portal each week.
Secret Agent Missions and Mission Journal	Between each child group meeting, children participate in weekly tasks, including playing 4 levels of online gamified learning, skills practice activities in day-to-day life and completion of a reflection journal.
Skill Tracker System	A short-term daily motivation tool is used to encourage children to practice specific skills at home and school, aligned with progression through each module of the program.
Funding Options	Places are available to privately funded clients and NDIS participants; however, we are not a registered NDIS provider. SAS support will facilitate the participant's capacity building in the following areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Social and Community Participation - Improved Relationships - Improved Daily Living Skills
